## ABOUT THE TOUR

During the Spring of 2021, SGT began to do zoom sessions with current living choral composers to learn more about their creative process, inspiration, and to dig into their pieces that were programmed for them. On one of these days, our singers met Sarah Quartel. This composer zoom was not ordinary - it was extraordinary. The connection that Sarah built immediately with our students and the connection they gave right back was palpable, even through a computer screen. After several email exchanges, it was decided that this connection needed to be explored through a composer-in-residence format.

We had no idea what that meant for us, but we knew it would be special.

Conversations around treble choir music, the lack of larger works for treble choirs, and the need to elevate and celebrate SSAA repertoire began to fuel incredible inspiration.

Many ideas about what the piece could be able were thrown around until a dissertation on the stages of womanhood in a Finnish poem was brought to the table. It seemed serendipitous as Sarah's mentors were in Finland and the characters of this poem represented many facets of not only girlhood but also humanity.

Once the seed was planted, it only made sense to create a tour that not only visited Finland, but also explored the European countries that celebrate and elevate the treble choir. The countries were are visiting have some of the best treble choirs in the world, including the award-winning Aarhus Girls Choir, SORA (formerly EVE),




Our students will be meeting and collaborating with over 200 singers from these countries!

Singing Girls of Texas is so excited to be traveling to Denmark, Sweden, and Finland from March 7-17, 2024. Please help support our students in their endeavors!



























































































### NOTES ON OUR PROGRAM

The Concert Chorale's program, Where Brave Souls Have Walked Before Us, is about life and death. Our first selection, Nun Komm, der Heiden Heiland, BWV 61, is a cantata by Johann Sebastian Bach. With its profound depth, Bach's music speaks not only to the Christian story of Jesus' birth but also to broader themes of hope and salvation. In the opening section, Bach combines the ancient Advent melody Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland with a French royal overture. Such an overture was played as the king entered, which is very fitting for the reading on the first Sunday of Advent when Jesus entered Jerusalem as a king riding on a donkey.

Claudio Monteverdi's Italian madrigal Si ch'io vorrei morire includes themes of desire. Death in this context is not a literal yearning for the end of life but a metaphor for a state of ecstasy where the lover wishes to remain forever, beyond the constraints of mortal existence. Next in the program is Norman Dello Joio's Come to Me, My Love, a setting of Sara Teasdale's poem Echo. It beautifully encapsulates the longing for the return of cherished moments or loved ones who have passed. This longing reflects the enduring impact of love and loss, suggesting that our connections with those who have passed continue to shape our lives and experiences.

The Dies Irae text, originating from the Latin Requiem Mass, vividly portrays the Day of Judgment. Z. Randall Stroope sets this ancient hymn to describe the human experiences of fear, hope, and the longing for peace. Abbie Betinis'

God of Owls is about seeking comfort and guidance in facing the unknown or feared aspects of life. It is a request for the strength to walk paths that others have bravely walked before.

Pavane by Gabriel Faurè is a reference to a slow, processional dance that originated in Europe in the 16th century. The work serves as a metaphor for the journey of life and the passage of time. The inevitability of the conclusion of the dance, and by extension life, is highlighted, emphasizing the natural cycles of life and death.

Alice Parker's Come Away to the Skies explores the transition from life to death. The song's emphasis on joy, celebration, and spiritual ascent offers a hopeful perspective on death, framing it as a continuation of life's journey rather than a definitive end. Our program ends with Carol Barnett's By and By, a reflection on life's burdens and the hope for redemption. The song envisions an afterlife free from earthly sorrows and offers hope for something beyond life.
